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COURSE DESCRIPTION

SEMESTER II

Course Code: KOR104
Course Title: Elementary Grammar- II
Course Credits: 4
Course Description: The objective of this course is to introduce more complex forms of Korean text such as short stories or essays and thereby equip the students with higher level of expressions and vocabulary, in addition, to higher level of grammar patterns such as suffixes, tenses and honorifics with formal and informal sentence endings to develop familiarity with texts and as well as with simple conversations.

Course Code: KOR105
Course Title: Listening and Oral Expression- II
Course Credits: 4
Course Description: The course emphasis is on exercises involving language comprehension and getting familiarised with common expressions in conversation of daily use and etiquette with focus on honorific, formal and informal speech forms with examples using nouns, pronouns, and verb particles that are unique to the language thereby aiming at expressional and colloquial accuracy.

Course Code: KOR106
Course Title: Reading and Written Expression- II
Course Credits: 4
Course Description: The course aims to introduce more complex forms of Korean text to students and equip them with higher level of vocabulary and

expressions, thus, enabling them to read small stories and essays, interpret and answer questions and describe the text in their words thereby, developing students' writing skills within the framework of the acquired knowledge of grammar and obtain expressional accuracy in writing and furthermore, to write creatively.

Course Title: Learning Korean through Society and Culture

Course Credits: 3

Course Description: Through language, the course aims to provide students, by introducing related vocabulary and phrases, an insight into specific topics of Korean culture and society.
