COURSE DESCRIPTION:

JPN 204: Reading & Writing 4:

Advancing from previous levels, this course focuses on advanced reading comprehension and writing skills. Students will analyse complex texts, literary works, and essays, honing their ability to express nuanced ideas and opinions in written form.

JPN 205: Listening & Speaking 4:

This course will introduce strategies that will help the student monitor, assess and self-improve their listening and speaking skills to achieve oral competence equivalent to A2.2/B1 through roleplay (Group Discussion/One to One Interview/Compering etc.) and speech.

JPN 206: Intermediate Grammar 2:

This course will introduce the students to grammar patterns at the Intermediate level and enable them to comprehend increasingly complex sentences.

JPN 207: Intermediate Kanji 2

By the end of this course, the student will learn to read and write three hundred *jōyō kanji* along with its relevant compounds. Further, s/he will learn how to use spaced repetition method to memorise Kanjis. At the end of this course the students will have learned a total of 700 Kanjis.

Sec 202: History of Japan 2

This course offers an overview of the history of Japan from the Tokugawa Period to the end of WWII. At the end of the course, you will be familiar with the main historical events and developments from the end of the Heian period to the end of WWII and its relevant keywords in Japanese.
