Credits : 3

Course description:

Course Title: Oral Expression and Listening Comprehension – II

Course Code: GER 202

Credits: 3

Course Description

This course is a continuation of the previous course. Complex and domain specific listening and speaking exercises, keeping in tune with the grammatical progression, would be taught. Stimulus based listening and speaking exercises, which train active and passive competence of the language, would be further trained.

- 2. Learn advanced speaking skills and gradually polish their pronunciation skills and complex sentence formation.
- 3. Learn to make structured conversations and group discussions and make short presentations

Course Title: Written Expression and Reading Comprehension – II

Course Code: GER 203

Credits: 3

Course Description

This course builds upon the previous course by progressing on various new written formats and reading strategies. As the grammar gets advanced in the course, the students have to apply the new grammatical structures and vocabulary to write longer texts and also read texts which are in the prescribed book as well as new texts provided by the course instructor.

Course Outcomes

- 1. Understand various new concepts of composition of texts by applying new forms of grammatical structure and domain specific vocabulary.
- 2. Develop reading skills in German by applying previous grammatical structures and new patterns of grammar and vocabulary to extract information from the text by developing various reading strategies.
- 3. Develop the ability to write longer texts and read longer forms of texts and extract information from the text and present it in a written form.

Course Code: GER 204

Credits: 3

Course Description

This course aims to further strengthen the grammar foundation necessary to acquire different skills in use of German language. Students need to master phrases and sentence structure to be able to read, write and speak German fluently. This course enables them to practice structures, vocabulary and also to develop their grammatical competence.

Course Outcomes

- 1. Understand concepts and rules of German grammar in order to use this knowledge in productive skills like speaking and writing.
- 2. Gain knowledge of the terms used in describing German grammar so that grammar rules can be easily understood.
- 3. Recognize and understand grammatical phenomena in written and spoken German texts.
- 4. Develop the ability to produce grammatically correct spoken and written sentences and simple texts.
