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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

JPN105: READING AND WRITING 2

This course is designed for students who have completed JPN Reading & Writing-1, and are seeking to develop their reading and writing skills. In this course, you will build on your basic knowledge of Japanese grammar, sentence patterns, and vocabulary to improve your ability to read and write in Japanese. The course will cover a range of topics including basic kanji characters, reading comprehension strategies, and writing skills for both formal and informal contexts through various exercises and activities, the student will learn how to read and write simple texts, express your thoughts and opinions in writing, and develop your overall proficiency in Japanese. By the end of the course, you will have developed the skills necessary to read and write basic Japanese texts, including emails, letters, and short essays.

JPN106: LISTENING AND SPEAKING 2

At the end of the course, students will understand sentences and frequently used expressions related to areas of most immediate relevance, such as basic personal and family information, seasons and weather, etc. Further students be able to communicate/describe his/her background in simple terms, the immediate environment. Also, they will develop the competence of intercultural understanding by taking up Japanese culture distinct from that of one's own.

JPN107: PRE-INTERMEDIATE GRAMMAR AND KANJI

In this course the students will continue to learn new patterns of basic Japanese Grammar such as conditional sentences, use of passive voice, causative forms of verbs, passive of causative, usage of honorific language etc.

They will also continue to learn 150 basic Kanji, their readings and Kanji compounds. At the end of this course the students will have learned a total of 300 basic Kanji.

SEC1: INTRODUCTION TO JAPANESE SOCIETY

At the end of the course, students will learn a basic introduction to the terms and concepts needed for an understanding of Japanese society from post-war to present-day Japan. They will also develop a critical awareness of their thoughts and opinions of aspects regarding Japanese society, and further, they will develop the ability to express the same verbally/in writing.
