SCOPE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE SEMINAR

The rapid development of artificial intelligence (AI) and digital technologies is reshaping communication, learning, and educational content. The Seminar on "Artificial Intelligence, Educational Communication, and Transformations" offers a global platform for scholars, educators, practitioners, and innovators to examine the far-reaching impacts of AI on education and communication. This event seeks to explore how AI and digital advancements are altering educational practices and societal interactions, particularly through the lens of "digital reason"—the embedded logic, ethics, and rationality within AI systems. AI and digital technologies are revolutionizing the production, dissemination, and consumption of knowledge. Through algorithms, data analytics, and machine learning, these tools are increasingly mediating access to information, influencing educational methodologies, and reshaping knowledge-sharing practices. The Seminar will critically analyze the ethical and practical dimensions of AI in education, addressing how algorithms influence curriculum design, personalized learning, and content delivery. While AI offers

potential for enhanced learning and efficiency, it also raises concerns around privacy, equity, and algorithmic bias. The Seminar will also investigate Al's broader impact on public discourse and democracy within educational settings, examining how digital tools shape classroom communication, academic communities, and public debate. Issues such as misinformation, echo chambers. and trust in educational institutions will be explored. Additionally, the event will spotlight innovations in educational storytelling, journalism, and artistic expression, emphasizing the importance of including marginalized voices considering factors like caste, gender, race, and class—ensuring equitable benefits from Al-driven advancements. Finally, the Seminar will confront the global digital divide, stressing the importance of equitable access to educational technologies. As AI continues to transform education and communication, it is crucial to address both the opportunities and the persistent gaps in access and participation across regions and communities.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- ♦ Individual Papers, Posters, or Performance Art: Submit an abstract with keywords of no more than 300 words via email to director.emmrc@efluniversity.ac.in
- ♦ Panel Proposals: For panels consisting of 3 or 4 presentations, one presenter can take the role of the panel coordinator and send a panel proposal. This proposal must include a panel title, a concise 150-word description of the panel's theme, and individual abstracts for each paper (not exceeding 300 words each). Please forward your panel proposals to director.emmrc@efluniversity.ac.in clearly indicating the panel coordinator's contact details.
- Each participant is allowed to submit only one abstract as a sole author, with a maximum of two abstracts in total, including one co-authored paper, for the Seminar.
- ♦ Abstract Details: The first page of the manuscript should contain the Title & the Abstract only. All submissions must include the author(s) name(s), their institutional affiliation(s), a brief biographical note and contact information, including a postal address and phone number in a separate file.
- ♦ Final papers: The manuscript should be about 3000 words (About 15 A-4 size pages typed in double space). The cover page should bear only the title of the paper, sub-theme, name/s of author/s, their official address, E-mail ID, phone numbers, a brief biographical note of the author(s) and acknowledgements, if any.

Over time, it expanded its scope to include e-content development under the National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (NME-ICT) initiative and the creation of Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) for the SWAYAM platform. Additionally, the Centre operates a DTH channel called VAGEESH under the SWAYAM PRABHA platform.



The English and Foreign Languages University (EFLU), Hyderabad, was established in 1958 as the Central Institute of English (CIE). In 1972, it was renamed the Central Institute of English and Foreign Languages (CIEFL) with the inclusion of three major foreign languages: German, Russian, and French. In 2006-2007, CIEFL was granted central university status through an Act of Parliament and became The English and Foreign Languages University. Dedicated to the study of English and ten foreign languages—Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Spanish, Italian, Russian, Japanese, Korean, and Persian—it is the only university of its kind in South Asia. EFLU is specifically designed to promote advanced research and training in teacher education, literature, linguistics, interdisciplinary studies, and cultural studies.
