The English and Foreign Languages University, Hyderabad, was founded in 1958 as the Central Institute of English (CIE), "a premier institute of language", by the first Prime Minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, to facilitate exclusive studies and research of the English language. In 1972, with the introduction of foreign languages into its teaching mandate, the institute was renamed the Central Institute of English and Foreign Languages (CIEFL) and, within a year, was conferred with the status of a Deemed University. In 2007, the Institute was accorded the status of a Central University and renamed The English and Foreign Languages University. The university offers academic instruction in English, Hindi, Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Spanish, Italian, Russian, Japanese, Korean, Persian, and Turkish, distinguishing itself as the only institution of its kind in South Asia. The university maintains regional campuses in Lucknow and Shillong.
