Dr. Swarnavel Eswaran is an associate professor in the Departments of English and MI (Media and Information) at Michigan State University. He is a graduate of the Film and Television Institute of India and the University of Iowa. His documentaries include Thangam (1995), INA (1996) Villu (1997), Unfinished Journey: A City in Transition (2012), Migrations of Islam (2014), Hmong Memory at the Crossroads (2015), and Nagapattinam: Waves from the Deep (2016). His research focuses on the history, theory, and production of documentaries, and the specificity of Tamil cinema, and its complex relationship with Hollywood as well as popular Hindi films. His recent books are Cinema: Sattagamum Saalaramum (Nizhal, 2013), an anthology of essays on documentaries and experimental films in Tamil and Madras Studios: Narrative, Genre, and Ideology in Tamil Cinema (Sage Publications, 2015). His essay, "Cinematography and the Poetics of 1950s Tamil Cinema: Maruthi Rao and Visual Style," is published in the current issue of Screen (Spring 2017).
